ABOUT THE HOSTS



Pontifical Academy of Social Sciences

The Pontifical Academy of Social Sciences (PASS), established by Pope John Paul II in 1994, aims to evaluate and elaborate on the Church's social teachings through the lens of social sciences. It organizes conferences, workshops, and research, publishing its findings. The Academy has addressed various topics, including human rights, religious freedom, work and employment, democracy, globalization, intergenerational solidarity, charity, justice, human trafficking and modern slavery.

The Academy is headquartered in the Casina Pio IV, a Renaissance villa in Vatican City, and consists of up to 40 members appointed by the Pope based on their expertise and moral integrity. Its President leads the Academy with the assistance of the Council. The Academy publishes its work in the Acta series, Scripta Varia, and Extra Series.



SDSN Youth

In 2012, the UN Secretary-General Ban Ki-moon launched the UN Sustainable Development Solutions Network (SDSN) to mobilize global scientific and technological expertise to promote practical problem solving for sustainable development, including the design and implementation of the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) at local, national and global scales.

In 2015, the SDSN launched its official youth division, SDSN Youth, to mobilize and empower young people worldwide and equip them with the skills, resources, and opportunities necessary to implement sustainable development solutions. With more than 1,600 youth trained, SDSN Youth fulfills this mission through diverse programs that empower youth to take action on their campuses, in their communities, and across cities and countries

THE 2025 SYMPOSIUM



This year's theme, **Voices of Change: Sparking Hope with Sustainable Solutions**, will prompt participants to consider how youth can envision and create a form of progress that — in the words of Pope Francis — is "healthier, more human, more social, and more integral."

Approximately 70 participants are expected at the 2025 Vatican Youth Symposium. Attendees and speakers will represent 38 countries, including 22 delegates from the global south. Forty-five participants are between the ages of 18 and 35, and more than half are women.



LOGISTICS

Dress Code

The **dress code is business casual**. In accordance with the Vatican's policies, attendees are required to ensure the following: shoulders and knees must be covered; clothing should not have rips, tears, or distressed elements; and sheer or see-through garments are not permitted. It is recommended that you bring a pair of flat shoes for the walk after the Symposium, as the paths are cobblestones, and you'll be walking downhill.



Getting to the Vatican

Please carry your passport, as you will be crossing an international border when entering/exiting Vatican City.

If you are NOT staying at Carpegna Palace: Your name has already been communicated to the Vatican Security. Instruct the driver to enter the Vatican through the <u>Perugino Gate at Via della Stazione Vaticana</u>. Vatican Gendarmes will check your name on their list and authorize the taxi to drive you to Casina Pio IV. Do not exit the taxi at the Perugino Gate, as it is a long walk to Casina Pio IV. The best thing would be to bring a printed copy of the program to show the Gendarmes where you are headed. Please note that taxis cannot enter the Vatican empty. To leave by taxi, you must exit the Vatican on foot.

If you are staying at Carpegna Palace: On April 3 and 4, a Vatican shuttle (SCV-plated) will pick up participants staying at Carpegna Palace at 08:15 and transport them to Casina Pio IV. We kindly request that you arrive on time. If there are any delays, SDSN Youth members will reach out to you.

Please note: There will be no return shuttle service.

Carpegna Palace Hotel is near the Cornelia subway stop on Line A, which is five stops from Ottaviano, the closest stop to the Vatican. The subway operates from 5:30 to 23:30 on weekdays and until 1:30 on Fridays and Saturdays. Each ride costs €1.50 and can usually be paid using contactless methods at the turnstile. Please watch your belongings when using public transport.
